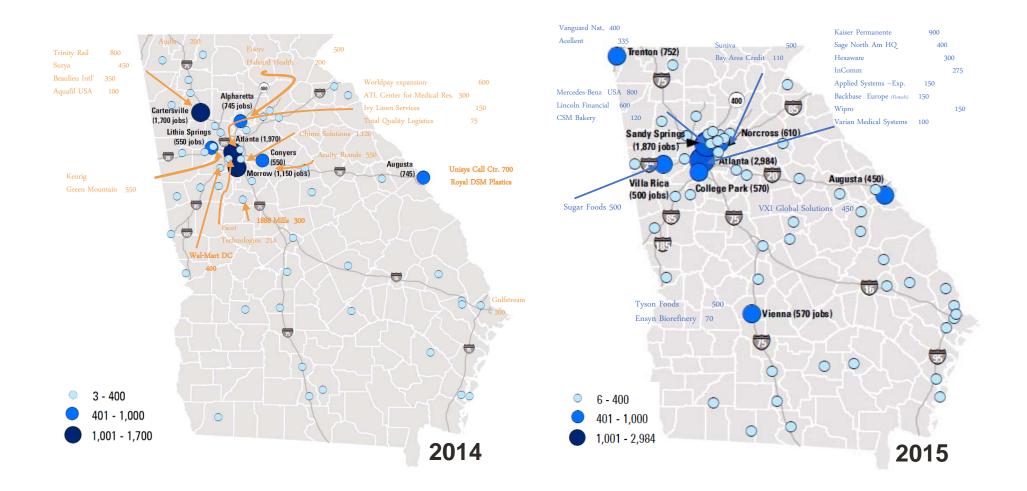

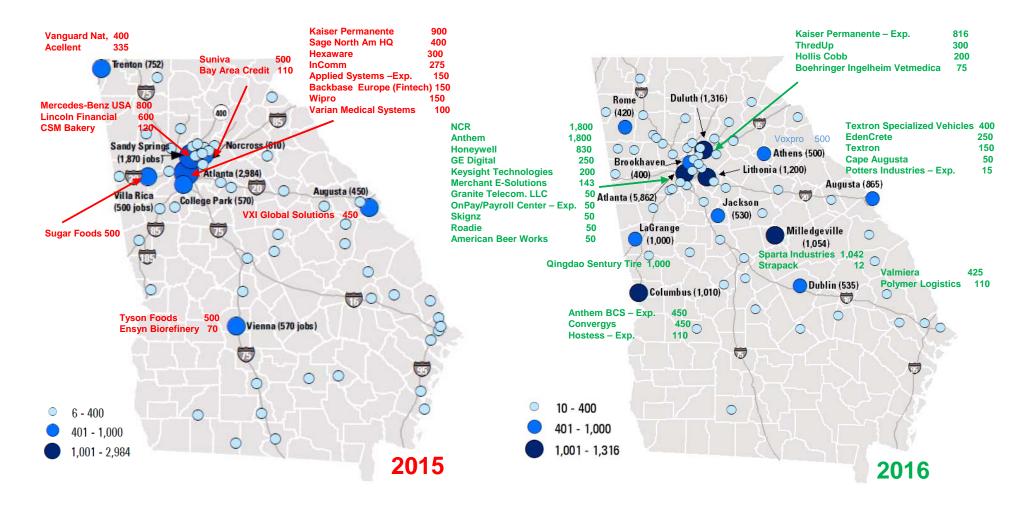

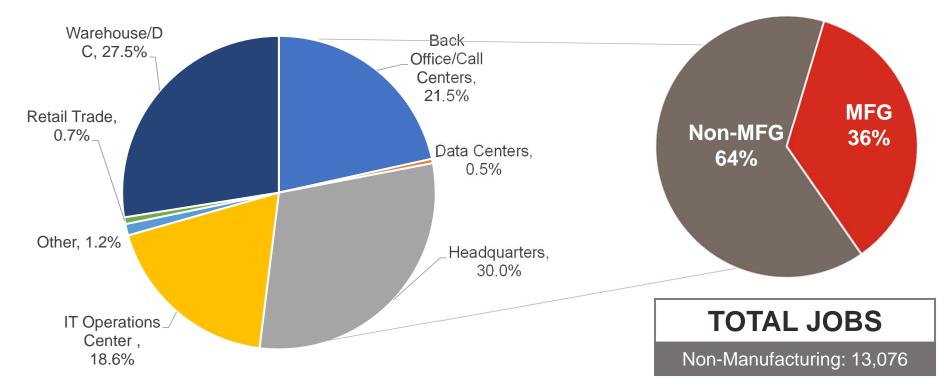
Job Creation by City: New and Expansions

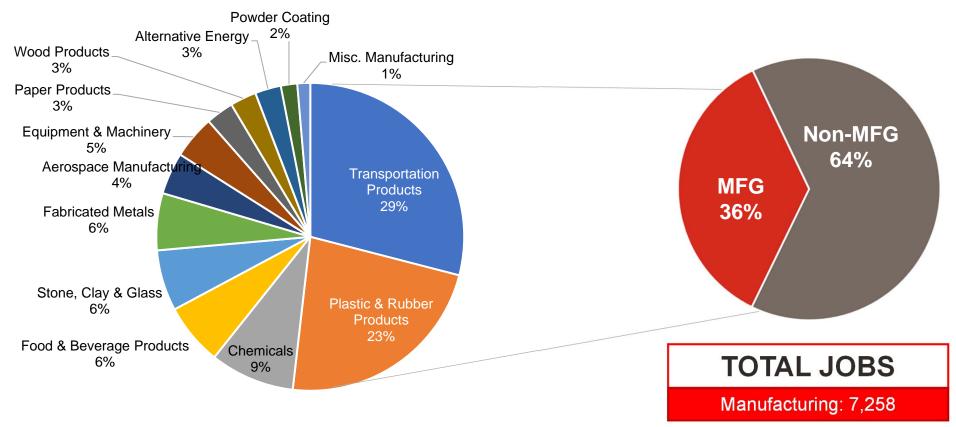


GPC ED Projects: NON-MANUFACTURING LOCATIONS 2016

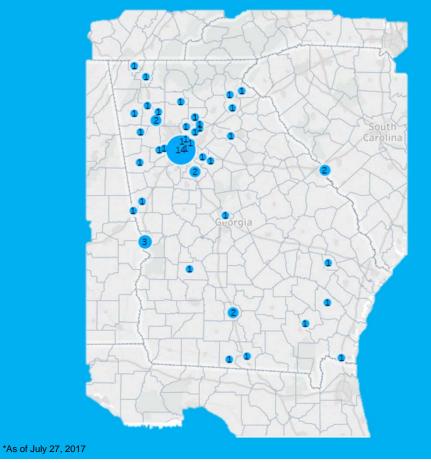
GPC ED Projects: MANUFACTURING LOCATIONS 2016

Number of Locations/Expansions by City

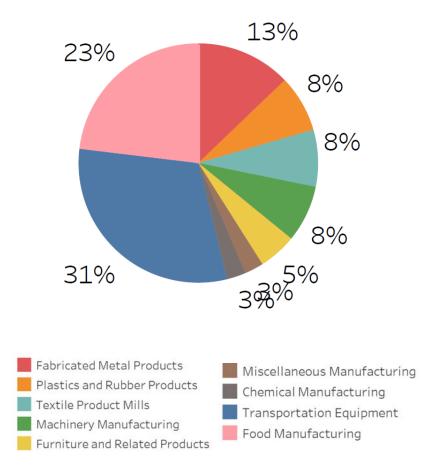


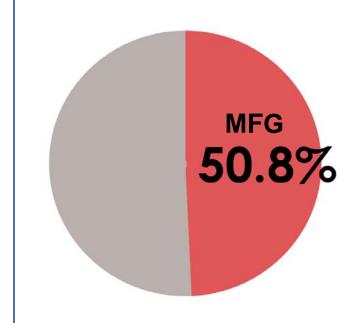

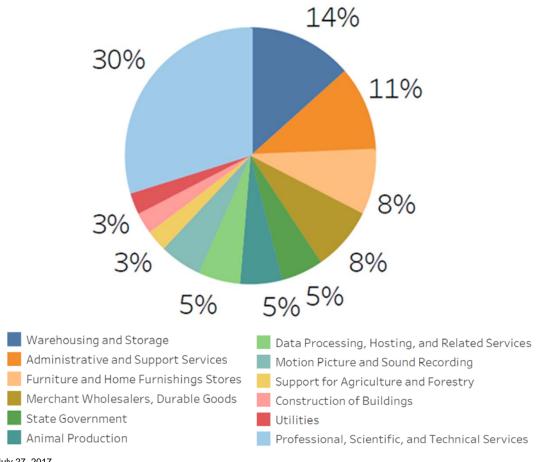

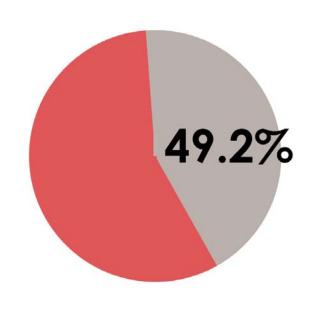
