## State's job market likely to slow in 2025

Still, Georgia has key advantages as country faces uncertainty.

Experts are forecasting slower job growth in Geor-gia and nationally as well as fewer interest rate cuts in 2025

fewer interest rate cuts in 2025 amid uncertainty over President Donald Trump starfif and fiscal policies, though some see potential positives from the administration's approach. Economic uncertainty is expected to slow job growth across the country this year, but there are some redeeming factors in Georgia's economy, according to a report Thursday From the Economic Forecasting Center at Georgia State University. ## 'We're not going anywhere, priest says after blaze

Catholic clergy vow to rebuild home destroyed by lightning-fueled fire.

Each morning, Scott Reilly would pray a specific prayer as the sun beamed through the windows at the home he shared with several of his fellow priests and missionaries in Forsyth County. The sunshine helped illuminate the rectory's chapel, full of golden wooden trim that accentuated a marble white altar.

Now, the remnants of that pristine altar are littered across the ground, and the walls and trim are either gone or covered in black ash.

As the sun was nearing the horizon on Feb. 16, a lightning bol struck the roof during severe storms that hit metro Atlanta, causing the home of the Legionaries of Christ's community to be engulied in flames, officials said. About a dozen Catholic priests had lived in the home for roughly six years.

### Officials drop ballot harvesting case from 2020

The State Election Board on Wednesday with-drew an investigation and dismissed a lawsuit demanding a conservative voting group turn over evidence of an alleged ballot collection scheme in the 2020 election in Georgia. In a unanimous vote, the State Election Board dismissed an investigation and a lawsuit seeking enforcement of subpoenas issued to True the Vote. The group alleged that unnamed organizations paid individuals \$10 per absentee ballot deliverate to drop boxes across metro Atlanta. The accusa-tions were never proven. "It is apparent that the whistleblower will not be identified or cannot be identified," said Janice Johnston, a Republican appointee.
